Hello Springers, it is a pleasure for your Social Committee to announce a few events for your future enjoyment. We are slowly bringing back events for this community to enjoy together and what better way to do that than to have a great July 4th 2022 party?! It is our biggest party of the year with both inside and outside seating.

Events planned so far are:

For next year, we plan on an Omelet Breakfast -	Saturday, Jan. 21, 2023.

We are looking forward to having these events and wanted to let everyone know a few of the ground rules for events at our clubhouse. We have a number of new residents who have lived here these last 2 1/2 years with no events so this is the time to bring everyone together again.

Flyers for each event will be emailed with The Springs Times Newsletters and posted in the Clubhouse. All tickets are sold in the Clubhouse card room on the first day of sales which is usually a Monday about 9:00am. Tickets are sold for 2 hours in the card room; CHECKS ONLY payable to "Springs Social Committee." After the first 2 hours of sales, Malisa in the clubhouse office will handle all other signups. Sign-ups are for at least one week in the office during normal office hours only. Each household can buy only 4 tickets. If you want to sit with certain people, 1 household can buy 4 tickets, another household can buy 4 tickets. You may sign up for the same table at the same time. Eight people will be seated together at the large round tables in the clubhouse. If

you are a single person, you may also buy 4 tickets. We will have at least one table or more for single people who wish to sit together. There are NO refunds after we place the food order for these events, usually 4-5 days before the event. If something happens and you cannot attend, you may find someone to buy your tickets. Call Malisa and let her know you cannot attend and see if we have a wait list. Only then can we return your money. Another option is to get your food to go the day of the event.

ALL Social Committee parties are BYOB / Beer and Wine. No Glass ever outside on the patio.

The Springs Social Committee is comprised solely of volunteers and we are always seeking other volunteers

Voter Registration/Re-Registration

Lillian Zelinski would like to remind those planning to vote in the California Primary (or other future elections) that they may need to re-register to vote. To assist Springers with that, she has dropped off Voter Registration Forms at the Clubhouse along with some flyers (flyer is on page 6 of this newsletter also).

First, there are three reasons to re-register: change of address, change of name, change of party affiliation. If change of party (Item 8), there may be no cross outs. If a mistake is made, a new form must be completed. For those who wish to be Independent, they should select No Party. A common mistake is selecting the American Independent Party. Residents can verify their information at voterstatus.sos.ca.gov.

The Guide on the next page walks voters through each of the 10 items to be completed. Other commonly missed boxes or mistakes:

Citizenship and Age: Yes / No boxes must be checked	Item 1
County where they live (address line)	Item 4,6
Birthplace: State or foreign country (not city)	Item 3
Missing ID information: DL#, State ID# or last 4 digits of SSN	Item 3
Prior registration (if registered before in CA or another state)	Item 6
Signature & Date	Item 10

BASICS FOR COMPLETING VOTER REGISTRATION CARDS (VRCs)

Item 1: Qualifications. The applicant must mark "yes" or "no" to the question of whether or not he or she is a United States citizen and if he or she is 18 years old or older. To pre-register to vote in California the applicant must mark the box indicating that he or she is 16 or 17 years old.

Item 2: Legal name. First name, middle name (or initial), last name, suffix (optional), and title (optional).

• Should match CA driver license (CDL)/CA identification card (ID Card).

Item 3: Identification. Date of birth and CA driver license/ID card number or last four of Social Security number

- Date of birth and U.S. state or foreign country (not county) of birth.
- If the applicant has been issued a CA driver license or an identification card, they MUST list the number.
- If they do not have either, they MUST list the last four digits of their Social Security number.
- If they do not have any of the above, they can still register to vote. Just leave the field blank.

Item 4: Home address. Home address, city, zip code, and county name. This should be their "Residential" address.

• Residence: Place in which the applicant's habitation is fixed and where the intention is to stay. For voting purposes, a person can have only ONE residence.

• P.O. Boxes and business addresses are NOT valid here.

- If the applicant does not have a street address, they can give an exact description of where they live.
- Cross streets, route, box, bridges, or other landmarks can be used.

• Mostly used for applicants living in rural areas with non-specific street addresses. Also used for applicants who are homeless.

Item 5: Mailing address. Applicants complete this section if they want to receive election mail at a different address other than their residential addresses. This is typically a P.O. Box or business address.

Item 6: Registration history. If the applicant was previously registered and changed his or her address, surname, or political party preference, complete this section. If the applicant cannot recall his or her previous address, it can be left blank.

Item 7: Vote by mail. To become a permanent vote-by-mail voter, the applicant must check the box marked "yes." This can be left blank if the applicant wants to vote at a polling location.

Item 8: Political party preference. Mark box to choose any of the political parties listed. If the applicant does not want to choose a political party preference, mark the "No Party/None" box.

• There can be only ONE mark in Item 8 with NO CORRECTIONS or ALTERATIONS. A new VRC must be filled out if an error is made.

• If the applicant wants to choose a "political body," they can write in the name on the "Other" line. *Item 9:* Optional Information.

• E-mail address and phone number. These are optional but recommended.

• To receive state materials in another language, mark the language preference box. If no box is checked, voter materials will be provided in English.

• To receive voting materials in an accessible format, mark the box.

Item 10: Affidavit. This item MUST contain the signature/mark/signature stamp of the applicant. Please include the date of signing.

Blue Box: If you helped fill out the VRC on behalf of the applicant (put pen to paper) or receive the completed VRC, complete the box. If you only answered questions or checked if the VRC was complete and did not receive the VRC, do not complete the box.
