





3. **EXECUTIVE SESSION ANNOUNCEMENT**: The Board discussed member discipline, legal and contractual matters at the executive session meetings held on March 27, May 9 and June 10, 2022.

4. MOTION CONSENT CALENDAR

- Approval of Regular Minutes from May 9, 2022: Stephanie Kroll made a motion to approve the May 9, 2022 regular minutes. John Gardner seconded and the motion passed 5-0.
- B. Treasurer's Report for the Period of May June 2022: Stephanie Kroll made a motion to approve the treasurer's report for May June 2022. John Gardner seconded and the motion passed 5-0. The Board of Directors has reviewed monthly for the operating and reserve accounts, the bank statements and reconciliations, current year's actual income and expenses compared to the current year's budget, check registers, general ledger and delinquent assessment receivable report.

The Board of Directors approves future monthly expenditures by CPM on behalf of the Association, of \$10,000 or more from either the operating or reserve account to pay, based upon the Association's approved budget, Board-approved contracts calling for monthly or progress payments and any other expenditures as required for the Association to operate.

5. OLD BUSINESS

A. Community Cable/Internet Agreement: Barry Gilbert made a motion to approve a one-year contract with Frontier, including a 4-year renewal for cable and internet, for a cost of \$59.43/unit. Stephanie Kroll seconded and the motion passed 5-0.

6. NEW BUSINESS

- A. Architectural Applications: John Gardner made a motion to approve applications #202239 202252, with the exception of #202245 which was denied. Jack Sheehan seconded and the motion passed 5-0.
- B. <u>Delinquent Report</u>: Barry Gilbert made a motion to write off the delinquent accounts as presented, Stephanie Kroll seconded and the motion passed 5-0. The delinquents were written off as follows:

- <u>C.</u> <u>Bid for Inspector of Elections:</u> The Board discussed that CPM does not qualify to be a third-party inspector and the HOA will need to hire a third party for all future elections. For the 2022 election, if election by acclamation is completed, the third party will not be needed. Barry Gilbert made a motion to approve Community Election Services to conduct inspector of election services. John Gardner seconded and the motion passed 5-0.
- D. Pool Coping Bids: The Board tabled until bids could be presented.

E. Updates:

- Committee Reports: The social committee requested to rescind their earlier request for
 funding for the welcome breakfast and goodie bags. The committee announced they will put
 together a more formal request with exact numbers for the board to review at the next
 meeting. It was also announced additional chairs will be needed for future events. The Board
 requested an inventory be taken to ensure we have enough chairs and/or need to order
 additional seating.
- Community Questions and Issues: There were a total of 24 owners present. The following items were discussed: Monument sign repairs and costs, pool repairs, clubhouse steps, common area goats, hybrid zoom meetings.
- NEXT MEETING/ADJOURN: Ron Kester adjourned the meeting at 4:33 p.m. The next meeting is scheduled for Monday, September 12, 2022 at 3:00 p.m. at the Clubhouse.
