From Lorraine Villarreal:

Below left is a tarantula hawk. Adult females go after tarantulas to feed their larvae. They sting the tarantula then carry them to their nest. They are not interested in humans but sometimes people get in the way and will get stung. If a person gets stung by them it is the 2nd worst sting known to humans. American entomologist Justin Schmidt created the Pain Scale for Stinging Insects, with the help of variably willing or unwitting test subjects. He once described the tarantula hawk's sting as 'instantaneous, electrifying and totally debilitating.'

Most animals know not to tangle with a tarantula hawk, but it is eaten by bullfrogs, kingbirds and road runners.

I understand we have tarantulas on Conejo & they periodically come down the mountain. These insects are about 2" long.

ED Note: About the same time, I discovered a tarantula had fallen into a small wastebasket in my enclosed patio room; luckily my brave friend, Donna Burger, rescued both me AND the tarantula and we both survived.

DRIVERS CAN SEE YOU AND HAVE TIME TO MAKE REACTIONS-The new reflective running vest combines LED flash lights and reflective gear. The drivers can see you from 1200 feet away even in the darkness and without any light reflection.

RECHARGABLE LED LIGHTs - Different from traditional running lights for runners because of its powerful front lights and safety warning tail-lights in the back. The visibility of LED lights for runners is 10 times that of other reflective gear at night. The LED running lights have longer battery life than the previous generation, fully charged in around 40 minutes and then work approximately 11 hours.

VENTURA REGIONAL FIRE SAFE COUNCIL (VRFSC)

Nearly 150 communities across California have created fire safe councils to help protect their homes and neighborhoods from the devastating effects of wildfire. They are contracted and funded through CalFire and private donations. The VRFSC is a 501c3 non-profit organization whose goal is to ensure that our local communities are fire resilient, safe, and prepared to withstand the threat of wildfire. To this end, for homes in high-risk areas (that's us), they will conduct free wildfire risk assessments, primarily focused on Zone 0, the first 5-foot perimeter around your home. They will discuss their findings with you and also send you a written report. It's for your information and there's no requirement to follow their recommendations.
