




(*To make sure we have enough time and space for everyone to use the service, please do not bring business docs. Please limit your shredding to no more than a few boxes or bags.)


Personal documents will be shredded on the spot. It is not necessary to remove staples or paper clips from your documents.

Documents containing Social Security numbers and identifying information; including credit card statements, applications, receipts, medical records, bank statements, tax, and legal documents, should be safely disposed of to avoid identity theft.

The shredding service to be at the Clubhouse for two hours on **Thursday, April 17**th **from 9am-11am.**

Beginning with Springs Residents: from 9am - 10am. Followed by the CCV Residents: from 10am - 11am.

This will be a drive through event. Please get in line, in your vehicle, on Irena heading up towards the Clubhouse where the truck will be located. Wait for your turn, and volunteer assistance, then exit via San Como Lane or Gitana.

The Springs FireWise Team

Saturday, March 1, 2025. The Springs community FireWise Team walked and/or drove around our streets looking for homes that fulfill the requirements to become a FireWise Community. We are still in the early stages of this project. Doing a Community Assessment is only step 3 of a multi-step process. If The Springs qualifies to become a FireWise Community it could mean we will have fewer insurance companies sending us "non-renewal" notices and could even allow us a chance of receiving special discounts. We are all in this together.

Things that we looked at on this assessment:

Is there defensible space in the 0-5' distance from the house?

Is there spacing between plants?

Is there dead vegetation under plants?

Are tree branches too close to your house or your neighbor's house?

Are you using combustible mulch?

Do you have dual pane windows?

Is your roof free from leaves or litter?

Is there clearance under trees?

Are there dead or dying plants or trees?

Do you have metal gutters?

Are your trees trimmed up 6' from he ground?

Are there any wood attachments to the house (fencing)?

We live in a Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) area and as such we are at a high risk for wildfires. Recent events have shown us the damage that can be done. It's not a matter of if we will have another wildfire, but when we will have one.

VENTURA REGIONAL FIRE SAFE COUNCIL (VRFSC)

Nearly 150 communities across California have created fire safe councils to help protect their homes and neighborhoods from the devastating effects of wildfire. They are contracted and funded through CalFire and private donations. The VRFSC is a 501c3 non-profit organization whose goal is to ensure that our local communities are fire resilient, safe, and prepared to withstand the threat of wildfire. To this end, for homes in high-risk areas (that's us), they will conduct free wildfire risk assessments, primarily focused on Zone 0, the first 5-foot perimeter around your home. They will discuss their findings with you and also send you a written report. It's for your information and there's no requirement to follow their recommendations.

Watch Duty is a non-profit, non-partisan, non-government organizatioon focused on disseminating public safey information in real time from verified sources. The service is powered by active and retired firefighters, dispatchers, and first responders who monitor radio scanners and collaboate around the clock to provide up-to-the-minute information. They alert you of nearby wildfires and firefighting efforts in real-time. If you think you smell smoke, Watch Duty will soon become the first place you check.
